

Calling all ex-choristers. Now is the time to get back into singing.


The St Mary's Scholars is keen to welcome new members and particularly seeks tenors and basses.

Richard Scarth - Organist

It is with deep sadness that we report the recent death of Richard Scarth. Richard will be remembered by many who sang in the choir in the late 1960s as a talented organist and accompanist with a keen sense of humour and generous character.

Richard joined the team as Geoffrey Holroyde's unpaid assistant organist in 1966 and played on the first "In Quires and Places" LP recording.

Colin Roy (also a past unpaid assistant organist from Geoffrey's time) played at Richard's funeral earlier in November and represented the St Mary's Ex-Choristers. Richard was 84. Although in good health, he died shortly after a fall.

Chairman attends Festival

The Annual Festival of the FCOCA was this year held a Rochester Cathedral on Friday 26 to Sunday 28 September. Nick Hodges and his wife Carolyn attended on behalf of the Guild.

The weekend began with a drinks and buffet reception hosted by the Dean of Rochester, The Very Reverend Dr Mark Beach. A recital by the King's Singers, a member of which, Christopher Gabbitas, is an ex-Rochester chorister, brought Friday to a close.

A demonstration of the temporary electronic organ was given by Director of Music, Scott Farrell and after Evensong on Saturday, sung by the boys, girls and men, the Festival Banquet was held in the Kings School with guest speaker, Andrew Carwood.

The 2015 Festival will be held in Exeter on 3 to 5 July.
